



Early Childhood Dress Code Policy

(Preschool & Pre-Kindergarten)

Please Note the Following:

- Our Early Childhood Dress Code Policy has been set in place to ensure both the comfort and safety of our youngest learners.
- Parents are encouraged to dress their child in clothing that is appropriate for playing and engaging in art-type projects.
- If you wish to purchase Uniform clothing items, please refer to our *Uniform Policy* under the **Family Resource** tab on our school website at nschristian.org.
- Early Childhood students may wear approved PE T-Shirts to school and they may be purchased through the [NSCS School Store](#), which can also be accessed through the school website.
- All clothing items must be in good repair and free from tears, holes, frays, and stains.

Clothing Items	Dress Code Requirements
Footwear	<p>Please Note:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All footwear must have a fully enclosed heel and closed toe. • Sneakers and rubber-soled footwear preferred. Velcro closure footwear is recommended. • Rain and Snow boots are for outdoor use only and may not be worn during the school day.
Tops	<p>Please Note:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • T-shirts must be free of graphics including; cartoons, superheroes images, etc. Solid colored T-shirts preferable. • Polos, Oxford-style shirts, turtle necks, etc. Are all permissible • Shirts may be long or short sleeve. • Hoodies of any kind are not permitted to be worn during the school day.

Bottoms	Please Note: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Girls may wear jumpers, skirts, and dresses. Shorts or leggings are recommended to be worn under these clothing items.• Shorts and pants of any kind are permissible, with the exception of denim (Jeans). Elastic-waistband bottoms are encouraged.
Hair/ Jewelry	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Dyed hair must be of natural color.• Hair touching the collar of a shirt is not permissible for boys.• Jewelry should be modest and not distracting to the learning environment.• No visible body piercings, except for ears, is permissible for students.
