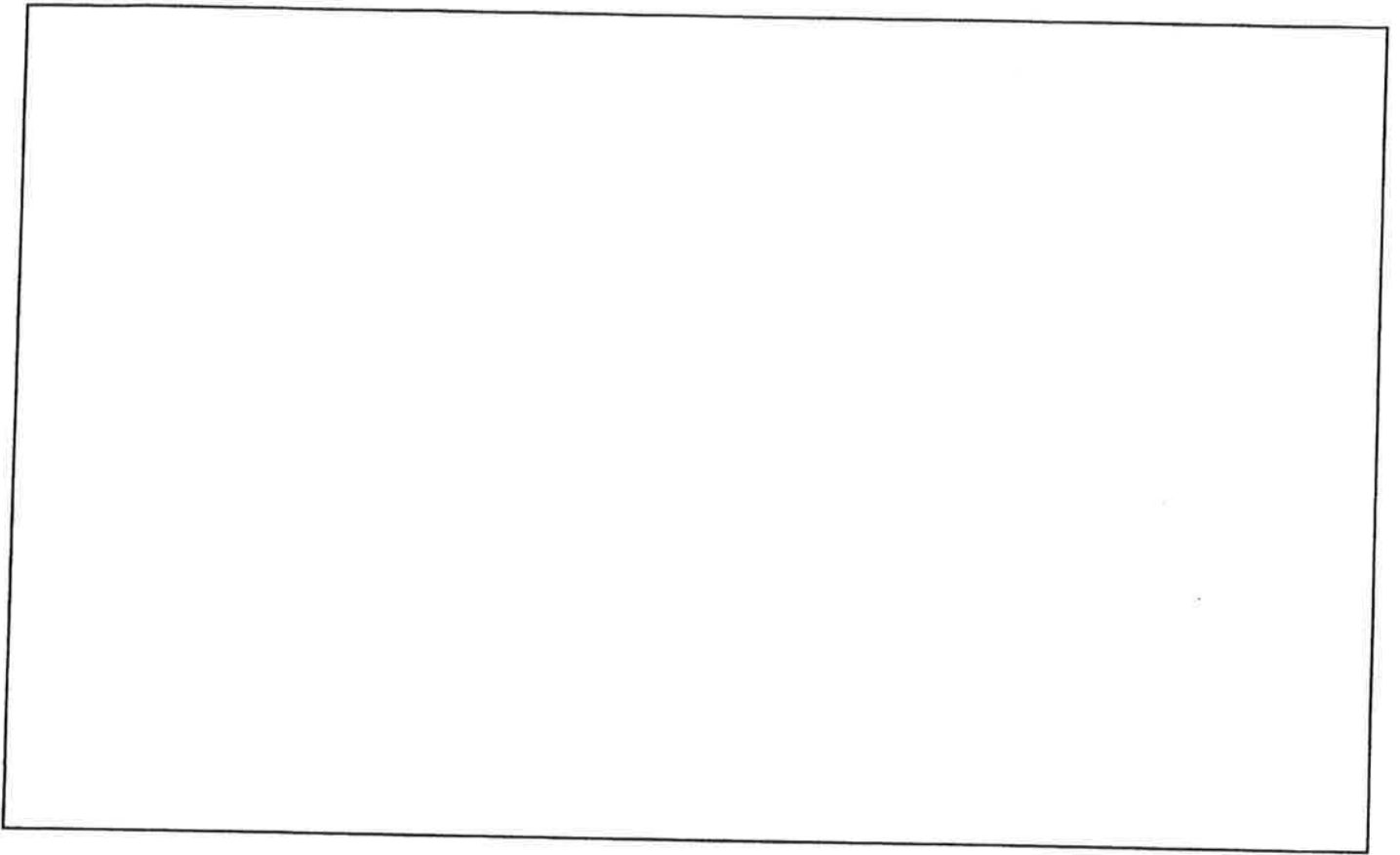

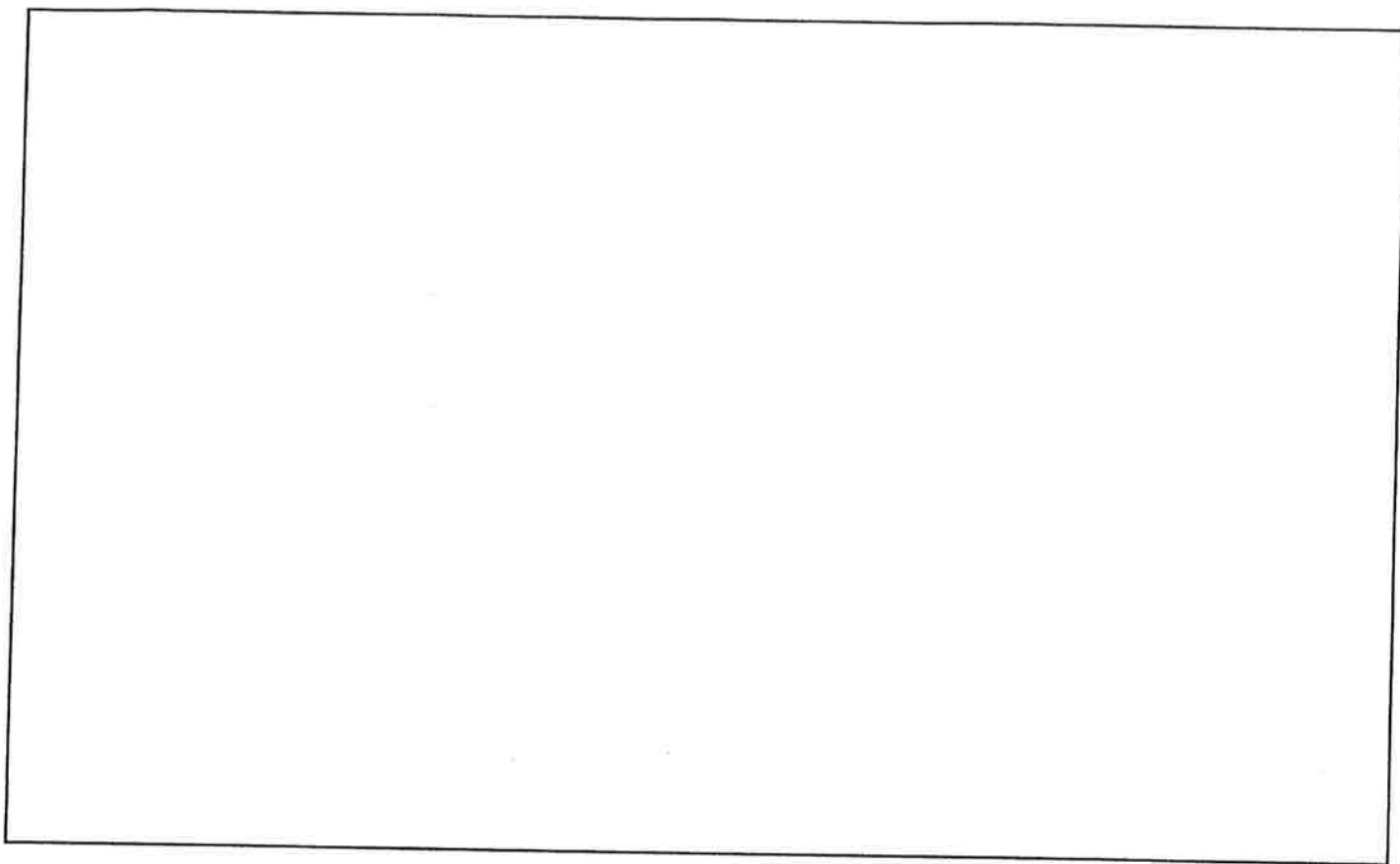
My Favorite Animal

A cat can run.

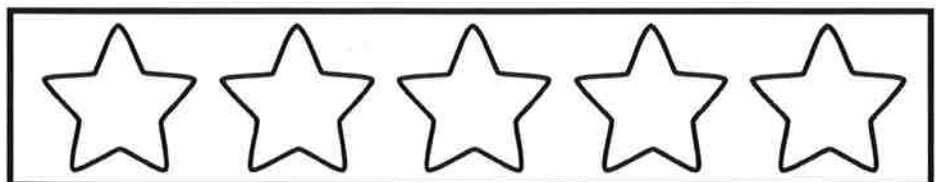
A dog can jog.

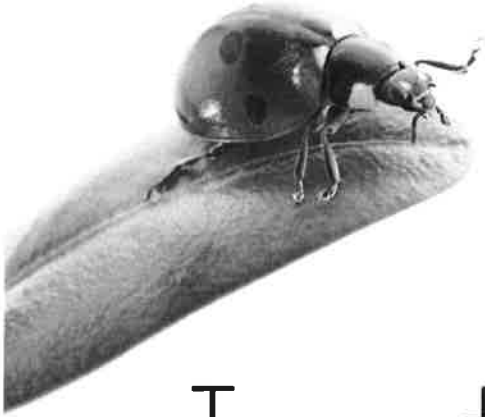
A dog can wag.

The bug had six legs.

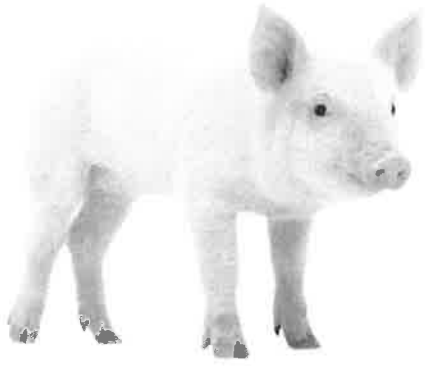
A bug can run.
